- As the public discourse on cellular agriculture enters the mainstream, it's getting harder to separate fact from fiction. We wanted to throw back with some recommended reading from 2012, when health law and science policy professor Tim Caulfield cautioned on the misleading "media cheerleading" around stem cell therapies. As the excitement around cellular agriculture continues to build, perhaps we should approach the conversation on cellular agriculture with a similar level of discretion. What do you think?
